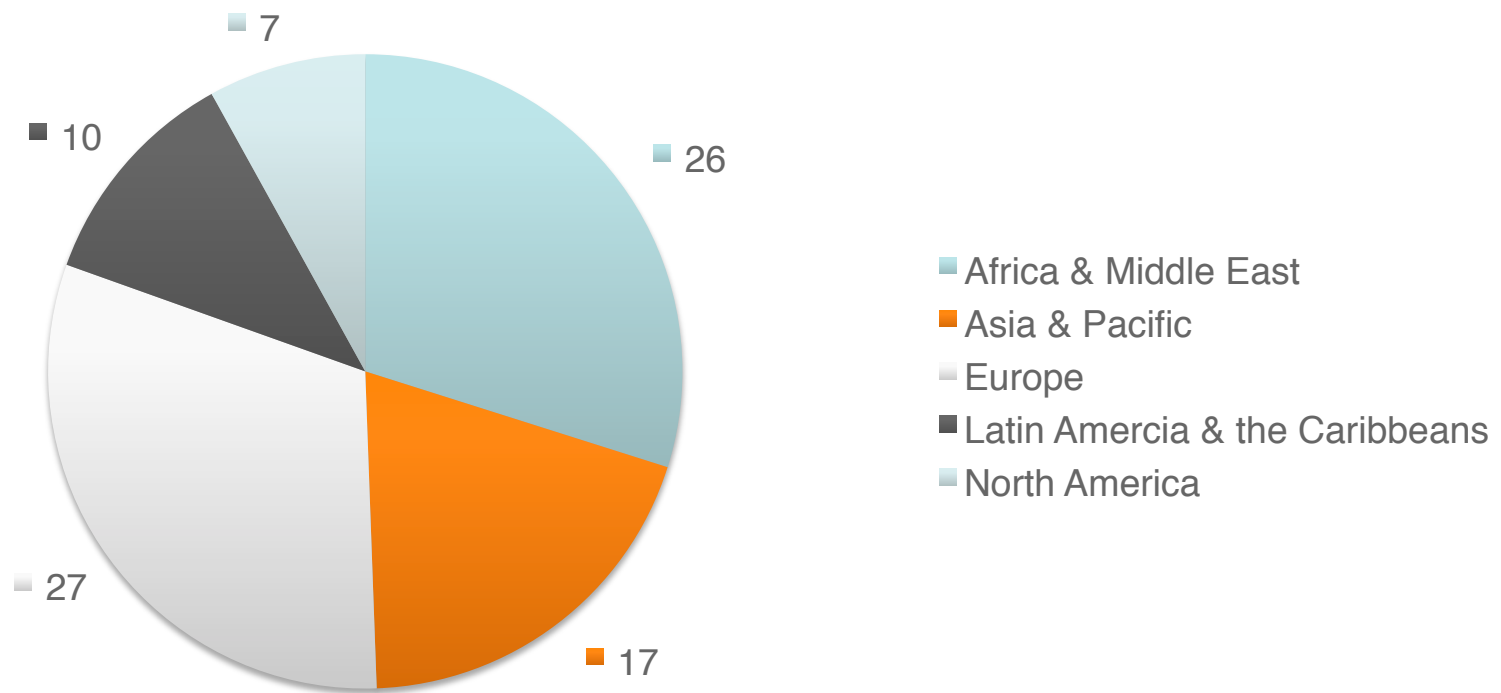

## Why does the Internet Society need Chapters?

- Chapters support & advance the Internet Society mission
- Extend reach and influence of the Internet Society
- Serve interests of the local community
- Act as a forum for 'networking'
- Provide input on global issues to the Internet Society



## Working as a Partnership

### Chapters

- Legitimate, active and visible in the local community
- In partnership with local stakeholders
- Provide input on local as well as global issues
- Active membership and pool of volunteers

### Internet Society

Provides Chapters with various support tools to:

- Organize local and regional events & participate in international meetings
- Carry out projects & training
- Manage members

## What do Chapters do?

- **Washington DC Chapter:** events on Net Neutrality
- **Ghana Chapter:** series of ‘Social Evenings’ – the first was on “Social Networking Benefits and Challenges”
- **DRC Chapter:** presentation of the Internet Society’s Next Generation Leadership programme in various universities
- **Chad Chapter:** project “School Net”
- **India Kolkata Chapter:** two day “Hands-On IPv6” workshop
- **Mexico Chapter:** participation in local Internet policy activities, namely the Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement (ACTA)
- **Senegal Chapter:** Series of “Dîners débats” launched around specific Internet themes
- **Philippines Chapter:** organization of the 2011 Philippine IPv6 Conference and Training

## What does the Internet Society expect from Chapters?

Minimum “performance standards” from both sides:

- Chapters must:
  - Establish with 25 members
  - 3% Membership growth (average over 3 years)
  - Have an Internet presence
  - Conduct one mission related event per year
  - Share ISOC policy positions in advance with ISOC
  - Have transparent leadership succession processes
- ISOC Global must:
  - Provide leadership development, training, support etc.

## Member Programmes and Funding

- **Membership Event Funding**
  - To help Chapter recruit new members via event(s)
  - USD\$ 2,000 available once per year
  - Info <http://www.isoc.org/isoc/chapters/funding/>
- **Community Grants**
  - To help Chapters conduct mission related projects
  - USD\$ 10,000 but Chapters must raise 25%
  - Info <http://www.isoc.org/isoc/chapters/projects/>
- **INETs & Chapter workshops**
  - To strengthen Chapters, build regional capacity
  - ISOC funds event but Chapters assist
  - Info <http://www.isoc.org/isoc/conferences/inet/>
- **Member opportunities**
  - ISOC Fellowships to IGF, IETF
  - Next Generation Leaders (see Toolkit)

## Successful Chapters

- Sustaining an active Chapter is hard work!
- What is the ‘**niche**’ in your country?
- **Inform, Educate, Influence** and/or **Implement**
- Neutral meeting place for all stakeholders to discuss important issues
- Some lessons learnt
  - Recruit your successors now
  - Involve the volunteers (Volunteer toolkit)
  - Have a large and diverse leadership team
  - Make it a goal to grow the number of members

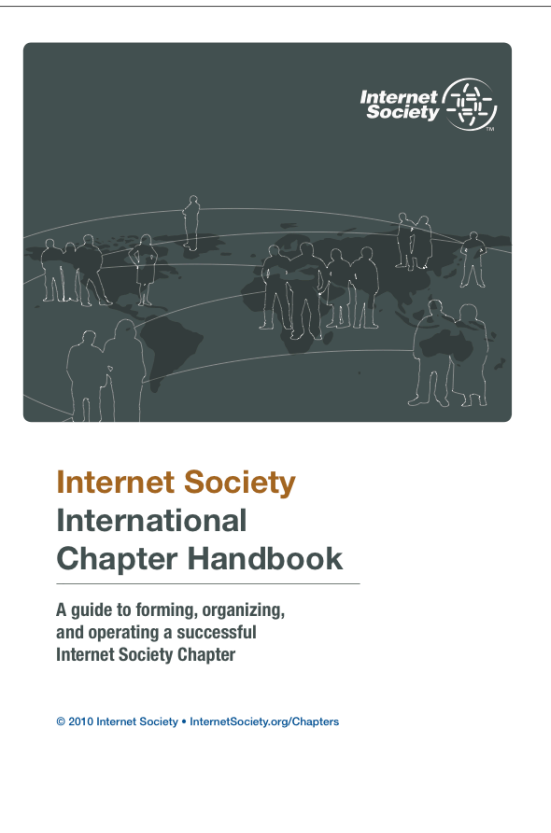

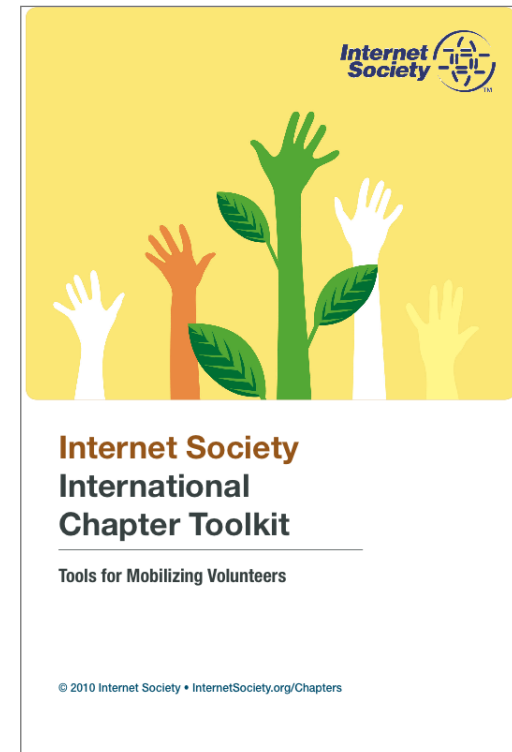
